

Where Education Matters

At Saint Dominic Catholic we have 31 professionals on staff. Of those, ten have masters degrees, two are currently pursuing masters degrees and one has a Phd. Five have 20+ years of experience in Catholic School education, Nine have 10+ years in Catholic School education, Four have 5+ years in Catholic School education.

Of our current Seventh Grade class, 44% scored in the 95th percentile on standardized testing and were recognized as Duke TIP Scholars.

42% of the our alum attending McGill-Toolen Catholic High School as Freshmen maintain a GPA of 3.5 or higher; 61% of our alum who are Sophomores, 36% of our Juniors, and 42% of our Seniors achieved the same status.
